Answer:

However, if conflicts are based on deeper problems, such as hurt or even hate then it is advisable that somebody such as a trusted friend or a minister in the church can help as a mediator. It is important that conflicts are not brushed away, but are addressed as soon as possible. As New Apostolic Christians we know that God is expecting us to make peace and reconcile, as well as to forgive, and that often needs humbleness and sacrifice of one's own motives and pride. Envy is causing the worst conflicts and is a sin we must overcome.

Every relationship encounters conflicts of all sorts at one time or another. Love provides the driving power and the motivation not to allow any separation by conflict. It is the biggest temptation and something where each one has to prove themselves again and again, after all oneness is a requirement Jesus' prayed for. u.h.

This is the journey of faith that I travelled from my collegiate years to my current job.

When I was in High School I dreamt of becoming a successful businessman. The first step to achieving this dream became concrete when I was accepted as a scholarship student in a private school for Business Administration. The scholarship covered only tuition fees and no other expenses. Although difficult, my parents did their best to keep me in that school. As fate would have it, I lost the scholarship due to inexcusable reasons.

I thought my dream to be part of the corporate world was dashed until I was accepted into a state university. The course on entrepreneurship looked enticing for me, but there was no longer any slots left for a late enrollee such as myself, and so I ended up taking an engineering course. At the beginning I trudged through the course with a rather heavy heart because I felt diverted from the course I really wanted. But since I really wanted to study and finish college, I eventually found joy in what I was doing.
